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	<p>in their Nativity as well performing to KS2 children in their singing assembly.</p> <p>In KS2, all children access weekly music tuition via singing assemblies, as well as music lessons with their class teachers. The Nottingham Music Hub Service provide Year 4 with whole class instrumental ensemble lessons (guitar). They are also given the opportunity to perform at their Christmas Carol Concert as well as performing to KS1 children in singing assembly.</p> <p>Across school there is a Milford composer spine includes both modern and classical composers with a range of diverse cultures and musical genres. This allows children to progress their knowledge of music skills.</p> <p>Milford also follows the Charanga spiral curriculum, which allows children to progress their listening, composing and performing skills in a way that helps them to keep revisiting key knowledge.</p>

Teachers participate in the NMS lessons, learning and performing alongside the pupils.</p> <p>All children participate in the first access programme, with 1:1 support provided for pupils as necessary. Reasonable adjustments (such as enlarging music or providing extra adult support) are made to ensure all children can participate as fully as possible.</p> <p>Children are given the opportunity to perform in assemblies and concerts, to embed skills, increase confidence and share music with the wider school.</p>	<p>Music Hub offers <a href="#">Whole Class Ensemble</a> or large-group programmes to all primary schools in the city – first access designed for year 4</p>	<p>Information about the first access (WCET/large-group) programme, how it fits within the curriculum, and signposts to opportunities for continuing to learn an instrument afterwards can be found on the NMS website.</p>

Pupils access this tuition with a specialist teacher on a Friday.</p> <p>All children participate in weekly signing lessons, as well as singing with their teachers in class. Children will be given the opportunity to join the school choir where they can perform at community events throughout the year. Provide space for rehearsals and individual practice and to store instruments</p>	<p>As a school we access the Music Hub’s instrument loan scheme to ensure there are enough instruments for all children to access their first access programme.</p> <p>Within school, we have many brass, percussion and string instruments available for class teachers to access. These range from ukuleles, djembes, ocarinas, glockenspiels and keyboards.</p> <p>We have a large open space with an interactive whiteboard in our hub for children to access and use these instruments. Class teachers often teach music there and it is a designated area for instrumental lessons and choir practise. We hold a range of events, including a Nativities, Christmas concerts, Christmas choir shows and the Year 6 leavers production.
