Access Skateboarding

Ages: 7+. Brendon Lawrence Sports Centre, Starting 26 March 10.30am-12.00pm every Saturday for 12 weeks. Free.

Sessions provide a thorough, safe introduction to skateboarding for first timers; alongside progression coaching for those who've skated before. Learners will work towards the new Skateboard GB 'Cruiser' Foundation-level Award for beginner skateboarders, also for free. Sessions will also cover wider creative/cultural aspects of skate culture, such as film, art and photography, alongside life-skills such as self-confidence and teamwork. 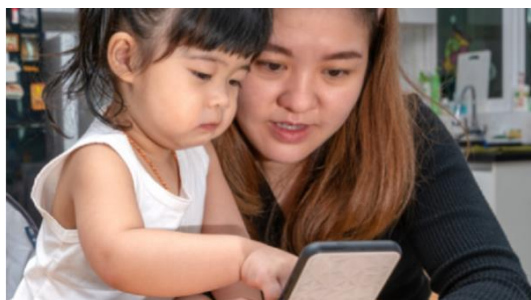

Nottingham Playhouse: Junior Young Company

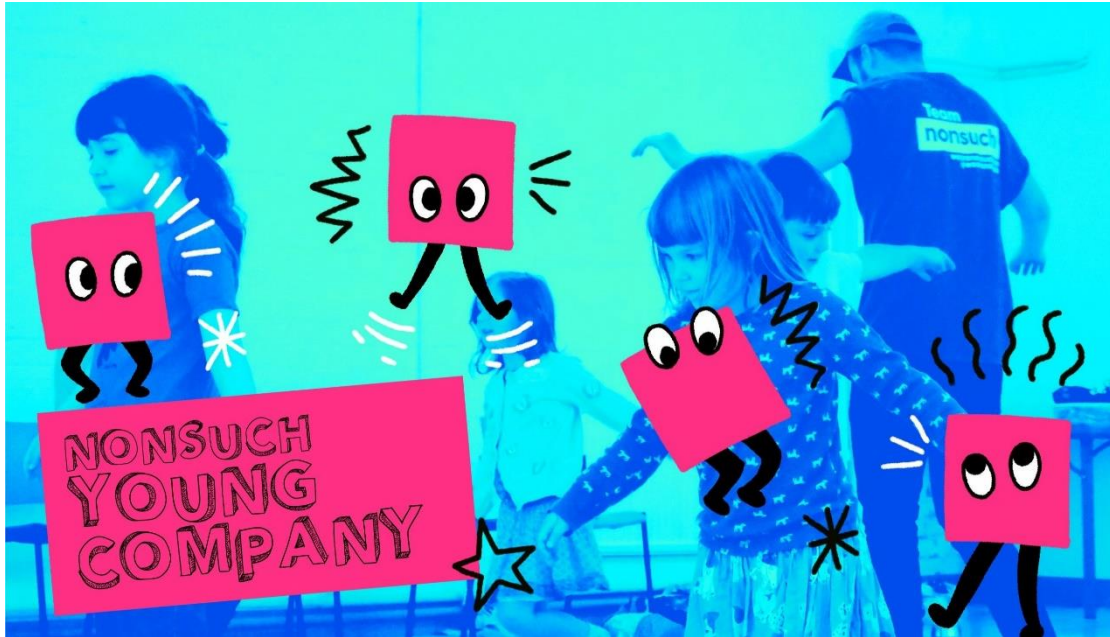
Ages 8-11. 11.45am–1.15pm Saturdays, Term time.

Nottingham Music Hub: Robin Hood Youth Orchestra (RHYO)

Ages 11-19. Saturdays 9am-1pm, Nottingham City centre.

RHYO plays a diverse range of music from classical to film to jazz. For 11-19 year olds in Nottingham City who can play their instruments to around Grade 4+. They rehearse once a week on Saturdays in the city centre (currently at the Nottingham Cathedral). The annual fee is £48 for pupils living within Nottingham City boundaries, £90 for pupils living in the county and £11 for young people eligible for pupil premium. For young people living or studying in the city, the annual cost of joining any music hub ensemble will be £54 (£15 concessions). Please note that you only have to pay one annual fee but can be part of more than one Music Hub ensemble. Base 51 is a safe and welcoming place for Nottingham's Young People.

Facilities include: A gym (50p per session), a dance studio (rates vary), kitchen, bouldering wall, table tennis, computers, games, arts and crafts.

The Hangout is a universal afterschool club for 11-17yr olds 3.30pm- 6.00pm on Mon, Tues, Thurs and Fri.

Mondays: **Art in Mind** 6.00pm-8.00pm for ages 11-17

Tuesdays: **F-Word**, 6.00pm-8.00pm, a young women's group for ages 16-24

Wednesdays: **OutBurst** (LGBTQIA+ group) 6.00pm-8.00pm for ages 15-19

Thursdays: **Youth Talk** (Podcast) 6.00pm-7.00pm
