age she made little figures. In 1939, the artist Augusta Savage was the first African American woman to open her own art gallery in America. Devoted to showcasing the work of black artists, 500 people poured into the opening reception, where Savage announced: "We do not ask any special favours as artists because of our race. We only want to present to you our works and ask you to judge them on their merits." In 1939, Savage was commissioned to create a sculpture for the New York World's Fair. Titled, 'The Harp', the work was strongly influenced by James Weldon Johnson's 1900 song, "Lift Every Voice and Sing."



Vocabulary Sculpture is artwork in three dimensions (3D) -length, width, sculpture and height. A sculptor is an artist who makes sculptures (3D art). sculptor Augusta Savage is a sculptor. Clay is a material used to model with. Some clays need to be clay heated to harden in a **kiln** but others dry in the air. Tools are used to **carve** the clay or to add patterns and texture. Clay can be found naturally in the ground. 'Score, slip, blend' is a clay joining technique. score, slip, Score both surfaces with lines, add watery clay (slip), blend then smooth the two pieces together (blend)

Tone

Tone is how **light or dark** something is. This could also be how light or dark a colour appears. Tone can be achieved by using a different pencil grade or using different pressure. Different colour tones can be achieved by adding grey, white, or black to a colour.

Texture

The feel or perceived feel of a surface. Different marks can give the effect of texture.

Perspective

In drawing and painting, perspective creates the illusion of depth using converging lines. By taking and arranging lines on a piece of paper, you can make your image appear as though it is three dimensional.

Light effects

2D drawings can look 3D using light effects, such as, highlights and shadow.
