


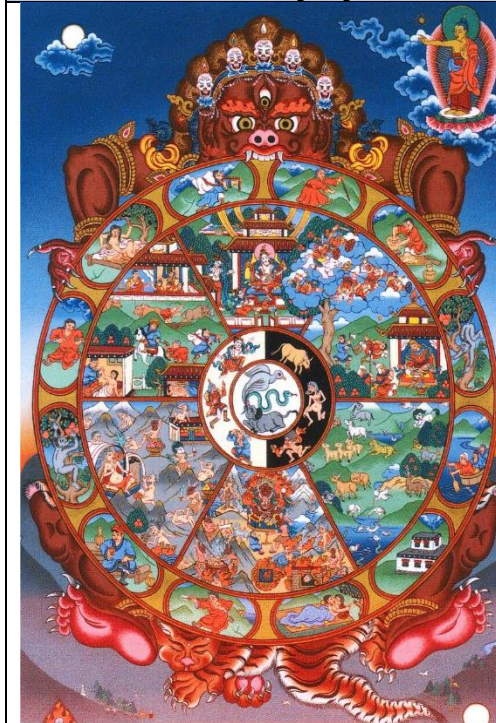
Key Vocabulary

cremation	Burning a body after death.
funeral	A ceremony that takes place when someone dies.
karma	This means deed or action. Buddhists believe that when they die, they are reborn into a new life depending on the deeds or karma they have done in their previous life.
legacy	something handed down from the past
memorial	A statue or structure built to remind people of a person or event. After Buddha was cremated, his ashes were shared among eight kingdoms and stored in memorials called stupas .
monk	A member of a religious group of men who promise to stay poor and do not get married.

Parinirvana

Parinirvana commemorates the death of Buddha and his passing into Nirvana. Buddhists believe that everything changes or is impermanent. So during Parinirvana, Buddhists think about changes in their lives, their own death and a rebirth into a different life. They also think about loved ones who have died. Buddhists may also visit temples and give gifts of food to monks during Parinirvana.

Wheel of Life

Buddha stands outside the wheel pointing at the moon because he is liberated from the wheel. The snake, pig and bird are all wants and desires. If you avoid these and take the right path, you will be reborn as a human. If not, you may become an animal! Hell is at the bottom of the wheel and heaven is at the top.
