#### **Medical Tracker**

After the half-term break we will be moving to using a new system for recording all injuries and accidents that occur in school called **Medical Tracker**. This is the UK's leading secure system for schools to record and report injuries and accidents. Instead of the physical slips of paper which we have been using, but which can get lost, if your child has any injury or accident in school you will now be sent an email notification to inform you of this. This will include - the nature of the injury / accident, the action taken and an update about if they are staying in school. For any serious injury / accident, especially those involving head injuries, we will still give you a direct telephone call to let you know as we currently do. There is no need to download an app to access Medical Tracker and no log in is required – you will simply receive email notifications –we will ensure we have up to date email address information for you after half-term.





#### Reminders and updates

Please help us make Milford the very best school it can be and a pleasant place for all by reading the following reminders and updates...

- Please ensure that anyone picking up / collecting Milford pupils are on the official 'collection list' with your child's class teacher

   we would also remind you that generally pupils should always be collected by someone over the age of 18.
- E-scooters having been sent guidance from the local council we do permit them to be on site but they must not be ridden on site from a safety point of view this is also the case for all other scooters and bikes.
- We would also politely remind all families that the only dogs allowed on site are assistance dogs – please do not bring / carry other dogs on site.
- All children should have correct PE kit that is separate from their school uniform – this is especially crucial as we move into hotter weather.
- School site is a strictly no smoking area please ensure this is followed at all times.
- We do not authorise any holidays taken during term time.
- Please ensure dinner money is paid each week on a Monday and that all MOOSE bookings should be made through the Gateway app – any issues please speak to the office.
