# Our expectations for year 6

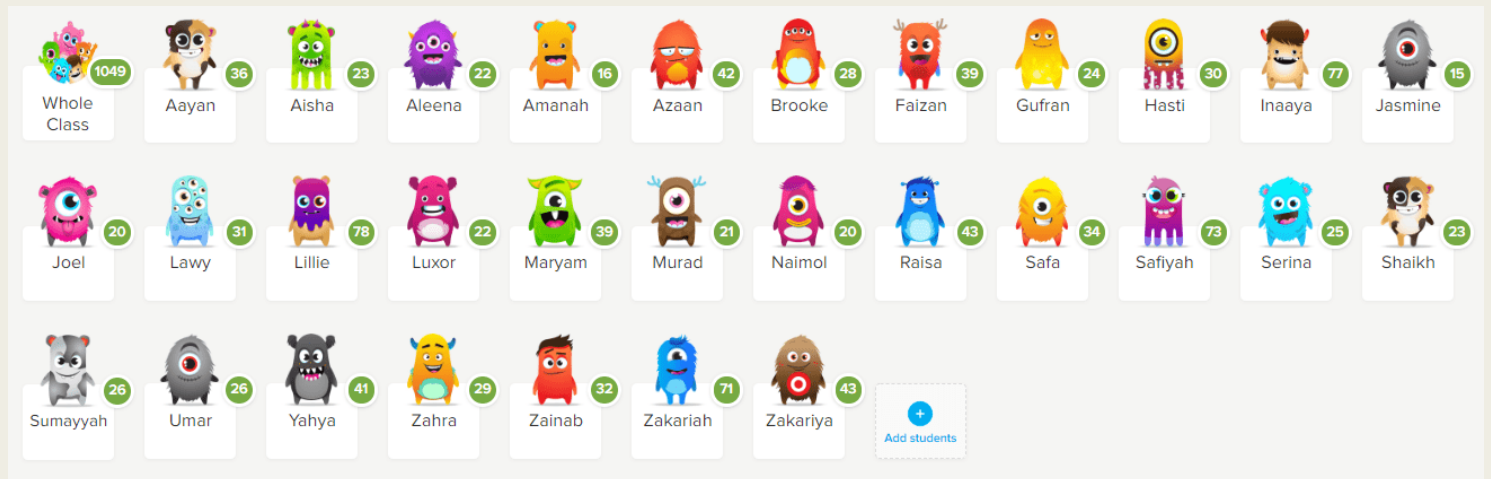
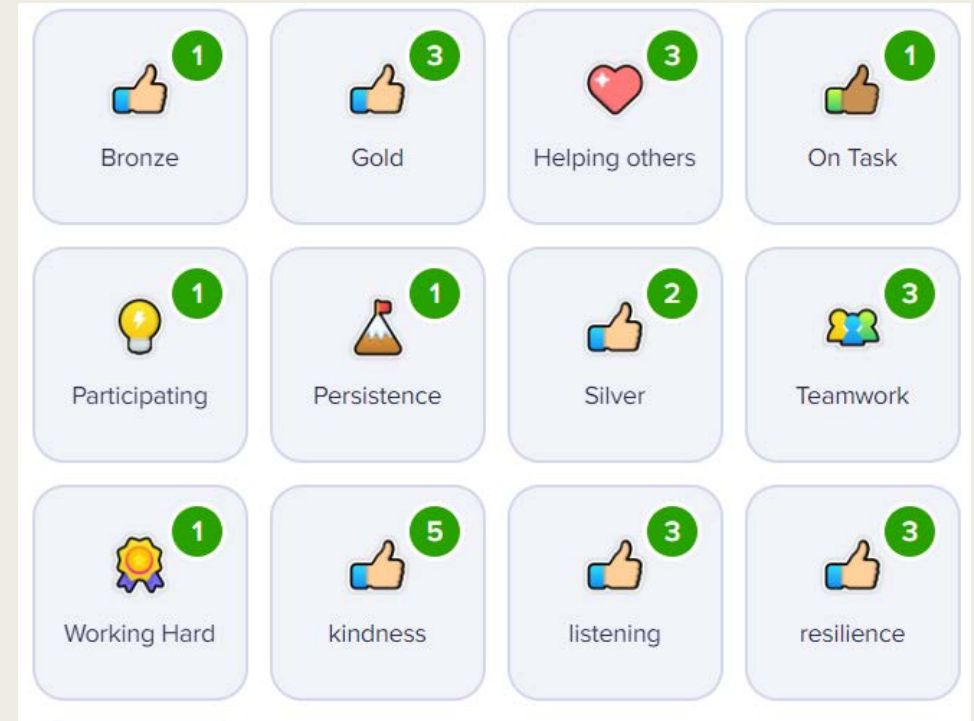
- All the children try their hardest in whatever they are asked to do

# Homework Expectations

- There will be a half termly homework posted on Dojo with activities for the children to complete which, mostly, link to the topic.
- There are no sanctions if the children do not complete the homework, but the children will be rewarded by being moved up the chart if they do,
- The children will have a reading book from school and a reading diary. The expectation is that the children try and read 4 times a week and write this in their diary. Certificates are given out in assembly each week for the best effort and stamps are given out to children as a reward.
- Spellings are sent home weekly, these will be in the children's diaries and they will be tested on these every Friday.
- There may be additional homework sent home in the run up to SATs.
