





Phonics and Reading



- We follow a Phonics scheme called 'Little Wandle Letters and Sounds.'
- Reading books get sent home once the children are blending independently. These book are to be read by your child to an adult at home.
- Library books children chose their weekly library books. They are for you to read with your child.
- Reading diaries please fill in the reading diaries every time you share a story together. If the children read consistently 4 times or more, they earn a reward at the end of the half term.

Our topic this half term... Let's Grow!

I hope you all had a fantastic Easter Holidays!

Alongside lots of wonderful books that we will read each day, we will be looking in detail at Jasper's Beanstalk, by Nick Butterworth, and Oliver's Vegetables by Vivian French. Throughout the half term we will be planting our own plants and vegetables. We will learn how to take care of living things.

The children will also be working with the school gardener on developing 'Fatimah's Garden', a fruit and flower patch in the Nursery garden as a tribute to our beautiful friend who we lost too soon.

We continue to practise our early phonics and maths skills at carpet time each day. During our snack time, we are promoting language and good manners, encouraging the children to speak in full sentences.

Last half term our topic was... Let's Pretend!

Wow, what a bury half term we had! We started with our book "We're Going on a Bear Hunt' by Michael Rosen. We went on our own Bear hunt around the garden. We also Looked at different artists, including Jackson Pollack, to make our mud pairtings.

Our second story was a traditional tale, 'The 3 Billy Goats Gruff. We looked at different types of bridges and had a go at building our own bridges from Lego, blocks, and outside using planks and crates.

The children are becoming fantastic storytellers and learnt lots of new vocabulary from each book, which they then used in their play.

Our Easter Stay and Play was a big success. The children loved taking part in activities with their family members and getting involved in Easter activities, including the egg hunt!

Attendance, Punctuality & Collection Arrangements

- Start of the day 8.45-9am (Doors close at 9am)
- Collection time 3.10pm
- It becomes a legal requirement for children to attend school during the Reception year, depending on the child's age.
- The expectation at Milford is that children attend at least 97% of the year and arrive on time.
- Attendance is monitored daily and parents are expected to phone the school on the first day of absence, giving reasons for absence in writing on the child's return to school.
- The hall/corridor doors are open from 8.45am to 9.00am.
- Since September 2013, Headteachers no longer have the right to authorise holidays during term time. You will find more information regarding exceptional circumstances and penalties for unauthorised absence in the Attendance Policy

- Food prepared by The Milford Academy catering team is contracted to Relish School Food and the menu meets the new food-based standards for school lunches.
