# Parents evenings - new booking system

We will be holding our Autumn term parents' evenings in the second week back after half-term. For most classes, the dates will be:

Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> November Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> November Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> November

Some classes may have slightly different dates and these classes will let you know. We are moving to using an online booking system, this system is used by many schools and makes booking your appointments a quicker and more effective process. A separate detailed letter will be sent out to you all today which fully explains the process of making online bookings – I understand any change can, at first, seem more difficult but we do feel that once you have used the system once, it will become a much better way to book appointments. We will obviously support any families who are having issues with using the online booking system.

#### Attendance update

Overall school attendance for Autumn 1 was 93.3% - the national average for all primary schools was 95.3% for this half term. We must all aim to improve our pupils' attendance and get it up to 95% or higher by the end of the year. Obviously when children are too ill to be in school we understand this but we do have far too many absences which are not due to this and this has a significant impact on each of these pupil's learning and progress – it is a major impact on their on-going educational achievement and leaves pupils with gaps in their learning and understanding. We will be sharing much more information about how we are working to improve attendance as this school year goes on – we need all of our Milford community to support us with this though and ensure our pupils are in school every day unless they are really not well enough to be in.



# **Key reminders**

- Please aim to read with your child 4 times per week this is the most important thing you can do to support your child with their education.
- School uniform we have an updated policy relating to our school uniform – copies will be available on parents' evenings – our main area to improve here is pupils wearing trainers which are white or multicoloured – we only allow black shoes or black trainers as per our policy.
- School is a non-smoking public site please also avoid smoking near or by the school gates so we keep a pleasant place for all of our pupils and families.

Messy play allows children to use their natural curiosity and engage their senses in an age appropriate way, which is critical for learning about the world and brain development. The children explored slime, made rainbow toast for snack time, painted with puffy paint, and made tie dye t-shirts. Outside, the children experimented with powder paints and made hand and footprints all around the garden. It was so much fun and the children were very proud of how messy they were at the end of the day!





## Kindness quilt!

Last June, a group of current Year 5 pupils worked with Mrs Foote to design and sew a quilt square to celebrate the RSE day theme of Let's Launch into Kindness. They enjoyed sharing kindness stories and converting them into shapes which the children then sewed onto the fabric. The boys and the girls had separate races which lasted 30 minutes in duration each. Each child would earn points for their team after completing one lap of 400m and then passing the baton on to the next child. The more laps the children finished - the more points the team would receive.
