

As readers we will be:

- Exploring the texts 'The Colour Monster', 'The Great Explorer' and 'Field Trip to the Moon'.
- Reading our reading book 3 times a week to help practice our phonics.
- Reading at home 4 times a week to help improve our reading.
- Listening and responding appropriately to adults and peers.
- Asking relevant questions to extend our understanding and knowledge.
- Using our phonics to sound out words.

As sportspeople we will be:

- Working on a range of throwing techniques and catching over a varied distance.
- Developing basic control and co-ordination when travelling and balancing and showing shapes of contrasting size through gymnastics.

As researchers we will be able to:

- Find out facts about Hinduism.
- Re-tell the story of Rama and Sita.
- Find out how Hindus celebrate Diwali.

As musicians, we will be:

- Listening to music and say whether we like it or not and why. Giving opinions and evaluating musical pieces.
- Clapping and responding appropriately to the rhythm and beat of the music.

As mathematicians we will focus on:

- Writing numbers to 10.
- Counting to 10.
- Finding 1 more and 1 less.
- Learning how numbers fit on a number line.
- Addition to 10.



As historians we will:

- Describe the achievements of Ranulph Fiennes.
- Suggest reasons to explain why the achievement of Neil Armstrong was so significant.
- Recognise and suggest reasons for the challenges explorers venturing to Mars will face.
- Identify the main motives of the explorer Christopher Columbus, describe what he achieved and give reasons to help understand why he was able to accomplish what he did.

As scientists we will be:

- Identifying and naming a variety of everyday materials, including wood, plastic, glass, metal, water, and rock.
- Sorting and comparing the materials objects are made of.
- Describing the properties of a variety of everyday materials and choosing one that is suitable to make a product.

As writers we will:

- Practise sounding out words using our phonics.
- Put finger spaces in between our words.
- Start to use capital letters and full stops in our sentences.
- Practise forming all our letters correctly.

In computing we will be:

- Discussing online safety.
- Learning simple controls on a computer, using a keyboard and logging on / off.
- Exploring the program Purple Mash.

As artists we will be:

- Looking at and creating our own self portraits.
- Finding out about the artist Vincent Van Gogh.
